The restoration included: terra cotta restoration and replacement, tuck-pointing, caulking, paint removal, and façade cleaning. - **HARRIS COUNTY COURTHOUSE** - A complete restoration was performed on all the terra cotta which consisted of rebuilding balusters and handrails that were demolished in the 1950's. Detailing of existing terra cotta included hand patching queen's crown and eagle's beaks. Other masonry restoration included: granite replacement, limestone cleaning, tuck-pointing, and brick replacement. Won award for 2011 PROJECT OF THE YEAR by Masonry Construction Magazine. Project Value - \$6,273,000
